- Avoid Low Information Content phrases
 - ☐ “in order to” simplified to “to”
 - ☐ ...
- L^AT_EX points
 - ☐ Only tex file (and possibly pdf files, or image files) are under version control.
 - ☐ Opening and closing “quotes” are used (`‘‘quotes’’`)
 - ☐ Periods that do not end sentences are followed by only one space:
`‘‘I like Dr.\ Smith.’’`, or for no linebreaks: `‘‘I like Dr.~Smith.’’`
 - ☐ Long names in math mode use either `\mathtt` or `\text`, or equivalent:
`coeff` (`\coeff`) versus `coeff` (`\mathit{coeff}`) versus `coeff` (`\text{coeff}`).
- Structure
 - ☐ There is always some text between section headings
 - ☐ There aren't instances of only one subsection within a section
- Spelling, Grammar and attention to detail
 - ☐ Each punctuation symbol (period, comma, semicolon, question mark, exclamation point) has no space before it
 - ☐ Opening parentheses (brackets) have a space before, closing parentheses have a space after the symbol

- Parantheses (brackets) occur in pairs, one opening and one closing
- There aren't instances of only one subsection within a section
